PAR Clubhouse

PAR Clubhouse is a program of the Canadian Mental Health Association/Peel Branch, that seeks to enable people with serious mental illness to live productively in their community. PAR Clubhouse is an accredited multi-service, best practice community mental health rehabilitation program. Our members are 16 years of age and over, have a diagnosis of mental illness, and are looking for rehabilitation. **PAR helps:**

- Build/enhance vocational, social and emotional skills,
- Members form/belong to Community,
- Provide a place to find/create/rediscover purpose, and a meaningful voice to take responsibility for one's life,
- Address basic needs of food, shelter and employment. Based on interest, members join and participate in areas of the clubhouse called Units. Working in partnership with staff, members use and strengthen their abilities, and gain confidence in the running of the clubhouse. This work provides a sense of belonging, accomplishment and an opportunity to build relationships.

Our Career Centre provides opportunities and resources for clubhouse members in their employment goals, through:

1. Group Employment

A group of PAR members work on a time-limited job to complete one-time or on-going projects.

2. Transitional Employment

Individual members work in a temporary part-time job for a

competitive wage. These jobs belong to the clubhouse and each individual member's needs are supported.

Other employment supports include:
Supportive Employment and **Independent Employment**, where members who are working receive required but flexible support.

Through community partnership you will receive fully trained, supported, dedicated and focused employees wanting to work. Jobs range from 4-40 hours per week in areas of general clerical, maintenance, cafeteria, etc. Jobs are guaranteed covered with zero absenteeism.

No Recruitment Costs - Your position is kept filled by a roster of PAR Clubhouse members who are willing and eager to work; PAR Clubhouse manages the recruitment process at no cost to your business.

No Training Costs - All new staff are trained by PAR Clubhouse at no cost to you.

No Turnover - We guarantee the position will be kept filled by a trained worker.

No Absenteeism - If a PAR Clubhouse worker must call in absent for any reason, a trained PAR Clubhouse staff member will work in their place at no cost to you.

A Message from the CEO

This message is written during a serious downturn in our economy where jobs are lost or at risk, food bank use has increased beyond our expectations, and acquiring housing is a struggle even for the Average Joe.

Our services in this environment are even more necessary as our clients and others who experience mental illness remain among society's most vulnerable citizens.

CMHA/Peel's role is to support recovery, and in doing that, support individuals to recognize they possess strength within. There is nothing so gratifying as to see a client who received support from a program giving back to another, going out to get a job, and actually experiencing recovery. That said, there is only so much our programs can provide within their funding envelope. Hence the need for our

members, friends and supporters to respond to our request for fundraising.

Youth Net, our *by youth for youth* program, is a unique peer-to-peer approach which sees incredible success in schools and at risk youth groups. The high level of youth volunteerism contributes to the efficiency of this unique program, yet its funding is seriously limited.

We know that employment is critical as a determinant of health, yet employment is under funded within the mental health system. Our clients want to work!! Additional fundraising dollars could support prevocational groups, career counselling, and provide valuable education, career materials and resources.

Finally, families are the backbone of the mental health system. They are there when no one else is....seeking answers, providing shelter, and making difficult decisions with respect to treatment. CMHA/Peel would like to build family-to-family education to support families in their efforts and to develop a valuable peer network specifically for families.

Yes, the economy is tough, but it's even tougher right now if you experience a mental illness and all the resulting impact on one's life. Each one of you *can* make a difference! You Do bring me flowers!
CMHA/Peel's Annual Geranium Sale

Do you feel like your theme song is: "You don't bring me flowers any more?" Take heart. We have the answer:

Volunteer for CMHA/Peel's Annual Geranium Sale! Although we can't guarantee the love of your life will be making the delivery, we *can* guarantee that *someone* will bring you flowers—geraniums to be precise. Or you can do the 'bringing' yourself by volunteering as delivery person.

Confused? Don't be. Here's the story:

For the past 23 years CMHA/Peel has held a Geranium Sale to raise funds for our programs. The way it works is like this: in April, Individuals from various companies and agencies in Peel region volunteer to act as a volunteer salesperson at their place of work. We provide flyers and order forms and the salespersons promote the sale to their co-workers and collect pre-orders. The lush plants come in four-inch diameter pots, in five colours—dark pink, light pink, red, white and salmon. They sell for \$5 each or \$3 for \$12. Approximately one week in advance of two delivery days, Wednesday May 13th and Thursday May 14th 2009 (before the Victoria Day weekend), salespersons fax or e-mail their order forms to us and we place an order with our supplier. Then, on the selected day another volunteer (**maybe you?**) delivers the plants and collects the money.

Easy, right?

CMHA/Peel runs a "spirited" United Way employee campaign

CMHA/Peel Branch celebrated the end of our 2008 United Way employee campaign by winning a Spirit Award at the United Way of Peel Community Achievement Event on February 5, 2009 at Pearson Convention Centre.



Getting into the spirit of the event, CMHA/Peel staff dressed in 1950's garb in tribute to the evening's theme and gathered around a motorcycle for a picture at the end of the evening.

Spirit Awards are awarded to companies and agencies that garner employee participation through financial giving, while at the same time running a "fun" campaign that reflects the spirit of United Way. CMHA/Peel achieved a 92% staff participation rate, and increased giving by 13.45% over 2007. The campaign slogan was "\$8,008 for 2,008" and we exceeded that goal. We celebrated our success at a breakfast event that included pancakes, speakers from two United Way funded agencies, raffles, and a "Toss the football" competition to complement our football theme. Events such as a Laser Quest challenge between program staff, a Spookghetti Lunch, and a Spa Day and Lunch, complete with hand massages and hair cuts, lent an air of merriment to the FUNdraising.

United Way of Peel funds three CMHA/Peel programs: Resource Centre, Youth Net and Community Development. CMHA/Peel CEO Sandy Milakovic, a member of the 2008 United Way of Peel campaign cabinet sent "a huge thank you to everyone involved. Now in a failing economy we need to support those in our community who are most vulnerable and you have demonstrated your commitment by this significant achievement."
